



Together We Learn – Impact & Update

Spring 2024 partnership schools yielded:

- 855 students completed the training
- 98% of students improved their understanding of laws related to driving
- 98% of students improved their understanding of how to act and react to law enforcement during a traffic and pedestrian stop
- Post training perception of law enforcement
 - 23% much more positive
 - 53% positive
 - 24% no change



Together We Dine – Impact & Update

Data includes December actuals and estimations through December 26

- 93 Dines completed (virtual and in-person)
- 3,195 people participated in a Dine
- 55 facilitator volunteers on roster locations include Waco, Houston, Atlanta, Boston, Skokie and Omaha
- 811 individual facilitator roles utilized and 1,653 volunteer hours served
- Traveled to: Oakland, Austin (2x), San Antonio (2x), Houston (2x), D.C., Midland and Waco
- Survey Says: 50% of all attendees participated in our TWD survey
 - The conversation format provided a confidential environment for me to listen to others and share my experiences.
 - 78% Strongly Agree | 20% Agree
 - I gained a new/different perspective on matters such as race, perceptions, equality, biases, social injustice and cultural differences by listening to the experiences of others.
 - 56% Strongly Agree | 33% Agree
 - After participating in this conversation format, I feel that I can better respect and appreciate the experiences of others as I reflect on my personal journey.
 - 58% Strongly Agree | 35% Agree
 - I would be willing to participate in another Together We Dine event either hosted by my organization or a monthly Project Unity Community Together We Dine event.
 - 70% Strongly Agree | 21% Agree
