## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

# TOGETHER WE DINE™

Together We Dine (TWD) is one of Project Unity's most successful programs. What started as a get-together where people of different backgrounds discussed race relations over a shared meal has grown and evolved into a national affair that has kick-started conversations about topics communities deeply care about, including political civility, disability, homelessness, education, immigration, and policing.

In 2025, TWD traveled all over Texas, as far as Washington, D.C., and Northern California, to gather diverse people together for good food and safe conversation. Attending a Dine event encourages people to speak on touchy topics in a friendly environment free of shame or judgment. TWD has been so successful that partner organizations return year after year to give their staff, students, and affiliates the opportunity to participate in the program.

Project Unity convened 85 Dine events in 2025 with the help of trained volunteer facilitators stationed around the nation. These events are putting Project Unity's mission on the map and sparking partnerships with over 40 organizations – from schools and universities to hospitals, churches, and businesses.

TWD partners include Texas Instruments, NTT DATA, the Dallas Police Department, the City of Coppell, George Washington University, Cedar Hill Collegiate High School and many more.

When participants are given space to have courageous conversations, they build mutual respect across class and status lines and create stronger communities. The proof is in the pudding. This is what attendees said after their dining experience:

*"I loved that three people at my table were from different countries of origin."*


*"Listening to the personal experience of someone involved in politics was extremely eye opening."*

*"I listened to so many great vantage points—from civic engagement, education, clergy. I am so grateful for the table, and the thought-provoking questions have challenged me to be more involved in the certification process of my business."*

# TOGETHER WE LEARN™

Do you know the reason why I stopped you? Do you have your driver's license and proof of insurance? Do you have any weapons in the car?

These are the kinds of questions police officers ask that students learn to answer in Project Unity's groundbreaking Together We Learn program. In the fall of 2025, a whole new class of students participated in Together We Learn through new school partnerships and funding from generous donors.

Together We Learn is an interactive educational program for high school youth that provides a positive dialogue forum with law enforcement officers to help educate students on how to act and react in traffic and pedestrian stop situations. This type of educational instruction is required for all driving-age students under Senate Bill 30, the Community Safety Education Act, inspired by the Together We Learn program in 2016.

687 seniors completed the TWL reboot session training course last spring, which included new instructors, revised materials and received ongoing support from Sewell Lexus Dallas and the Dallas Police Department, especially the department's community engagement team under Danny Young.


Retired law enforcement officers are also participating and leaving a lasting impact on the kids who come through the program.

Participating schools include Cedar Hill Collegiate High School, Crosswinds Accelerated High School, David W. Carter High School, International Leadership of Texas Charter School, Jesuit Preparatory School of Dallas, Johnson Alternative Education Program, Naaman Forest High School, and additional schools in the process of onboarding for the spring 2026 semester.

Big things are coming for Together We Learn. In the fall, the program went on hiatus to be revamped for the coming school year so that Together We Learn can more than double its impact on students.

## Spring 2025 Facts & Figures

- 687 Senior students completed training out of 1,033 students
- 95% of Students improved their understanding of laws related to driving
- 96% of Students improved their understanding of how to be a safe driver
- 97% of Students improved their understanding of how to act and react when they encounter police officers while driving, as a passenger, and/or as a pedestrian
- Post-training perception of law enforcement:
  - 24% Much more positive
  - 37% Positive
  - 37% No change

In 2025, I saw students gain more than information; they gained confidence. They learned their rights, their responsibilities, and—just as important—the humanity on both sides of the badge. This program doesn’t lecture; it equips. It doesn’t divide; it prepares. By creating honest, respectful dialogue between students and law enforcement, Together We Learn is helping shape safer streets, wiser choices, and a generation that knows how to stay calm, stay informed, and stay alive. That’s not just education—that’s community care in action.”*

# TOGETHER WE SING™

2025 Together We Sing was a stunning success. Hosted at the Meyerson Symphony Center, Project Unity's signature fundraising event draws extraordinary musical talent from across the country for a night of inspiration, unity, and incredible performances.

With a nearly sold-out crowd, this year's performance featured the fabulous Clark Sisters, producer and conductor Leon Lacey, the one and only Dallas Symphony Orchestra, and the remarkable 200-voice Unity Choir, which has been serenading audiences across North Texas all year and has received invitations to sing at Carnegie Hall and throughout Europe. For four years running, Together We Sing has been hosted by the incomparable Keith Solis of Smooth 105.7, who is currently in training to become a Together We Dine facilitator!

This year's Together We Sing event raised nearly \$500,000, which supports about half of Project Unity's annual budget. The funds go toward Project Unity programming that heals and shapes communities across North Texas and beyond.

Together We Sing also hosts a masterclass program that draws student musicians, many from disadvantaged communities and living in foster care, for a day of fun and instruction to nurture their talents under the direction of Leon Lacey and the Dallas Symphony Orchestra.

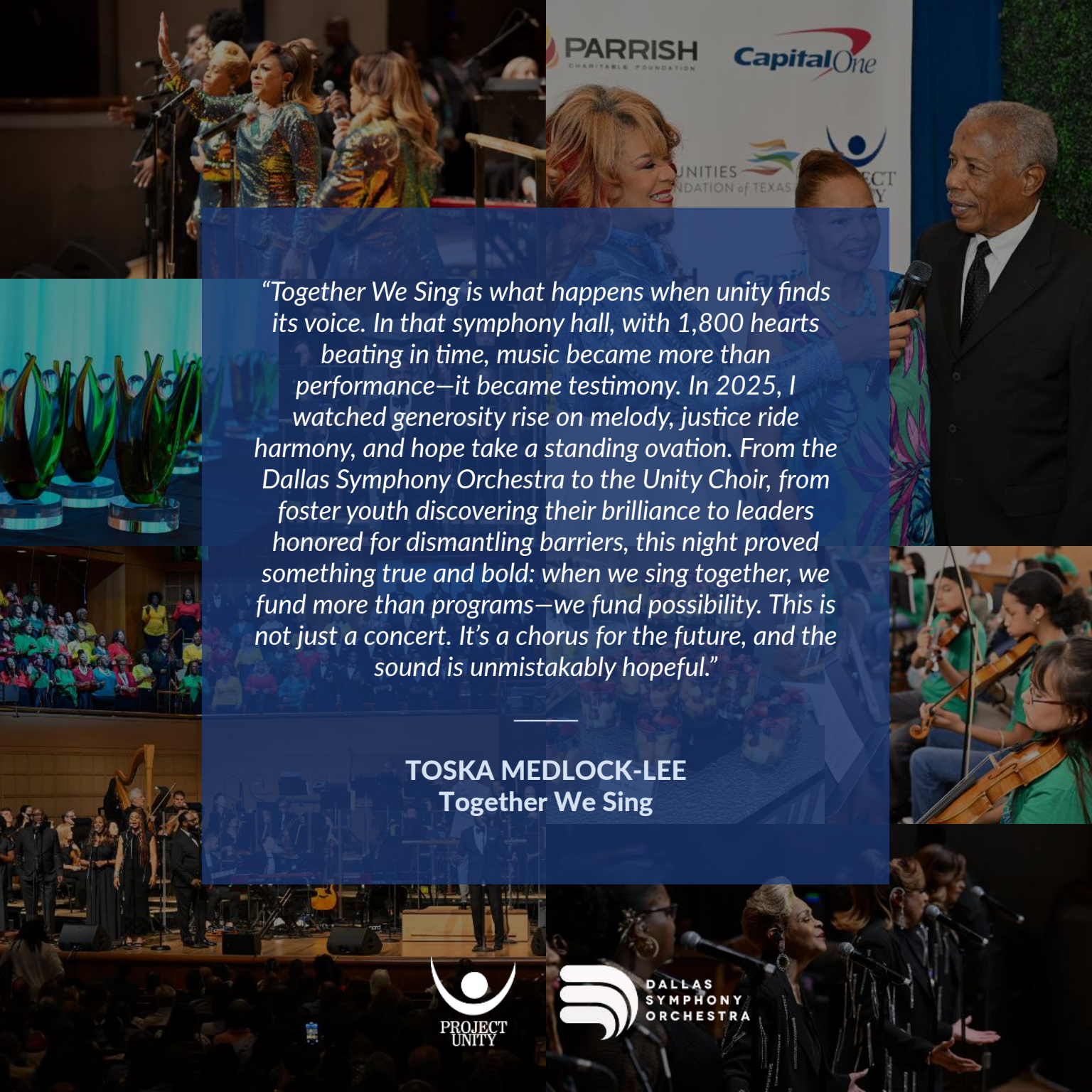

# TOGETHER WE BALL™

Together We Ball is one of Project Unity's most anticipated community events of the year, bringing together family, neighbors, and community leaders for a full day of fun and competition. Together We Ball returned for its ninth year in 2025, bringing the people of Dallas its signature family-friendly entertainment, competitive basketball, food, activities, a skills-and-drills camp, and special guests.

The free, day-long event was held at SMU's Moody Coliseum thanks to an epic partnership between Project Unity and SMU's Athletic Department. The community came together – basketball players, families, police officers, clergy, and more – for headliner exhibition matchups, giveaways, and college scholarship awards. DISD Chief of Police Albert Martinez won the Old School Free Throw competition.

Special guests and participants included State Champion Coach “Nick” Smith of Kimball High School, SMU Men's Basketball Coach Andy Enfield, Mavs Academy Coordinator and Dallas Wings NBA Jr. Coach of the Year Candice Isaac, and Director of Cultural Intelligence for Athletics at SMU Brenda Scott. Event sponsors and partners included the Dallas Mavericks, the Rashid Giving Fund, the Dallas Police Department, Fire Department, DART Police, the Sheriff's Department, and the Dallas Examiner.

This year, Project Unity doubled the number of scholarships it awarded to students, providing \$1,000 scholarships to four deserving students – three SMU students and one Texas Woman's University student. Generous funding was provided by the Michael Kedron Fund and Crane Brogden, LLP.

## THE COLLAB LAB

Iron sharpens iron in the Collab Lab. We kicked off our fourth year of making a difference in the workplace in 2025 through the Collab Lab's virtual and in-person collaborative discussions led by Terri Hatcher, Head of Inclusion and Belonging, North America. Organizations that participate in the Collab Lab gain cutting-edge insights into key cultural, technological, and employee engagement topics that can improve how they operate, enabling them to better serve their clients and team members.

The program brings industry insights, shared resources, and valuable tools to participating corporate partners through bi-monthly meetings. For its annual Collab Lab Day hosted by Communities Foundation of Texas in June, Project Unity was excited to bring Dallas-area experts and thought leaders together to share their who shared their insights and wisdom with our partners. The panel included Dale Petrovsky of the Dallas Regional Chamber, Kelvin Walker of the Dallas Citizens Council, TJ Gilmore of Strategic Partnerships, and former Dallas Mavericks CEO Cynt Marshall.

Project Unity has fostered partnerships through the Collab Lab with organizations such as Texas Instruments, Communities Foundation of Texas, Marsh McClennan Agency, Jackson Walker LLP, TRG and others. 2025 Collab Lab topics included executing cultural initiatives within an organization, thriving together in North Texas, and getting AI-ready. These meetings have become important learning and networking events for Collab Lab participants.

## DALLAS POLICE-COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Project Unity has partnered with the Dallas Police Department at nearly every level of operations, and together, we are making a major impact on Dallas. Not only do DPD representatives participate in Together We Ball and Together We Learn events, but we are also integrating and sponsoring programs that provide greater opportunities for the public to interact with law enforcement, build trust and relationships, and make communities safer.

Together We Dine is now institutionalized at DPD. Every police academy class participates in a Together We Dine experience. Project Unity continues to maintain the DPD Chief Advisory Committee which serves as community voice to the Chief of Police, as well as supports other community programs and events such as the Blue Goes Pink Cancer Walk, the annual food drive at Paul Quinn College and more.

# & INCLUSION PROGRAMS

## LISTEN & LEARN SPEAKER SERIES

For the fifth year in a row, Project Unity invited communities to learn from individuals whose life stories serve as inspiration and have made an impact on history in some meaningful way. The Listen & Learn Speaker Series provided an online event featuring special guests who shared thoughtful perspectives on their life journeys and experiences, as an offertory measure to inspire each of our personal journeys of understanding, learning from our history, and embracing all circumstances that make us unique.

In September, as part of the Tomorrow's Women Alumni Leadership Speaking Tour, Palestinian and Israeli women traveled together across the United States, sharing firsthand stories of living through conflict while choosing dialogue over division. Their joint appearance at Project Unity—highlighted by a moving conversation between Tamar and Yara—offered a rare and hopeful model of empathy, resilience, and shared humanity.

The fall continued with a deep exploration of moral leadership and cross-cultural partnership. In October, author Stephanie Deutsch brought to life the legacy of Julius Rosenwald, whose collaboration with Booker T. Washington helped create nearly 5,000 schools for Black children in the segregated South. Her talk illuminated how education, philanthropy, and allyship can transform generations.

That legacy came full circle in November with Kenneth B. Morris, Jr., a descendant of both Frederick Douglass and Booker T. Washington. Morris reflected on the intertwined histories of these leaders and shared how the Frederick Douglass Family Initiatives continues their mission today—working to build strong children and dismantle systems of exploitation and oppression.

Together, the 2025 Listen & Learn speakers embodied Project Unity's core belief: that understanding grows when we listen deeply, honor truth, and choose relationship as the foundation for justice and peace.

*"The Jesuit Social Justice Program is where formation meets action. In 2025, I saw young men step out of the classroom and into the real work of community—listening deeply, planning thoughtfully, and serving with intention. This partnership doesn't just teach students \*about\* justice; it invites them to practice it, shoulder to shoulder with others, in spaces where courage and compassion are required. When seniors help lead Together We Learn and Together We Dine, they're not just earning service hours—they're shaping the kind of leaders they're becoming. This is how faith finds its feet."*

## JESUIT SOCIAL JUSTICE PROGRAM

Project Unity's partnership with Jesuit High School continues to thrive. In 2025, the Jesuit Social Justice Program brought 16 new seniors on board for another hands-on learning experience that trains them to help Project Unity plan and implement Together We Learn and Together We Dine programs for their classmates, as well as engage them in learning about social justice matters through exposure to Project Unity partners.

The opportunity is part of Jesuit's mission of the Office of Service & Justice and the Senior Service experience, which allows Jesuit students to serve alongside others, understand more deeply the systems of society, and be challenged to orient their lives in service to others. As of the fall 2025-2026 school year, over 60 young men have served as part of Project Unity's service Wednesdays.

The commitment and generosity of our volunteers are the lifeblood of Project Unity, and it is because of their service that we can make such a big difference in the community. 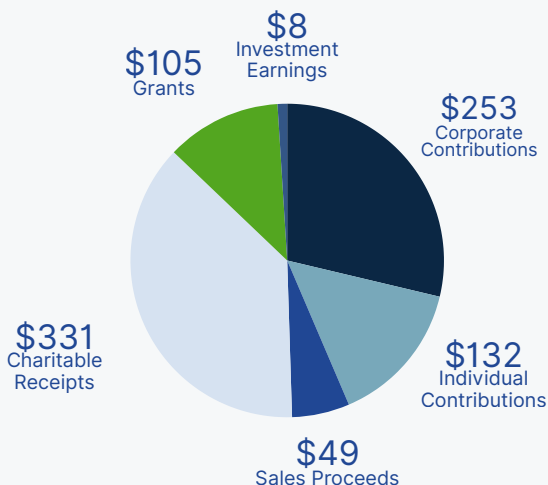

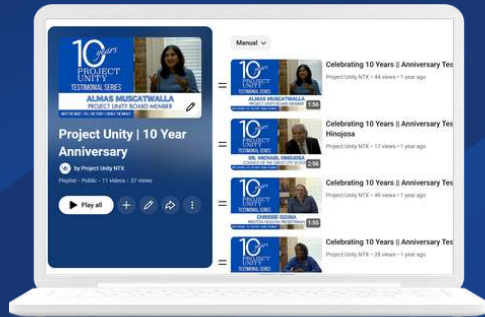
